Political Signs, banners and/or flags. – Per the Rules these items are allowed to be displayed ONLY for NATIONAL elections and may NOT be placed in yard or on home more than 60 days before the national election day. 2024 National election day is November 5, 2024 so no signs may be placed prior to September 6, 2024. No signs, flags or banners are allowed to be displayed where visible for any other local or state elections, only the NATIONAL Presidential election.

Reminder on lamp posts: per the rules and regulations of the park; each home is required to have an operational lamp post that must be illuminated during evening hours (dusk to dawn) and must be operational year around. Please make sure that your lamp post is in compliance.

Hurricane preparedness It is hurricane season so anything that could become a projectile will need to be stored or secured for the safety of all.

Inoperative vehicles: Per current rules effective March 1, 2022, "No junk, inoperative or unlicensed vehicles may be used or parked in the community at any time." Owners will be given a 24 hour notice for removal prior to it being towed at their expense.

Yards and homes: Please make arrangements to have your home cleaned and beds weeded as summer means mold and weeds. Failure to do so will result in a 14-day notice to cure the situation, followed by staff doing the work and your account being charged if not done in a timely manner. This includes properly disposing of the pulled weeds, not just letting the yard waste linger on your lawn creating dead spots as this too will be cleared by staff if needed and charged to the offending resident. Garbage or yard waste may not be placed on street any earlier than 4 p.m. the night before scheduled pick up. Violations of this rule has resulted in Country Lakes staff removing the items and charging the resident. The intent is to minimize the amount of time we have to look at trash or refuse.

Gate Update- As of this writing, we still have not been given a firm date yet when the gates will be operational but hopefully, we will in the very near future. As of now they will be open during the day just like the old gates were.

There will be ability to enter a 4-digit code at the two main entry points if you **do not** have your clicker. **The 4 digit is your lot number. If you have a 3-digit lot number then add a zero in front. EXAMPLE- Lot 200 = 0200. There will be either the pound (#) key or the star (*) key preceding the 4 digit or after, we have not been apprised as of now. This information should NOT be given out to anyone that is NOT a resident.**

Visitors will be able to find the person they are looking for in the call box directory that will be located at the main entrance to each park and call them on that call box. When the resident picks up, they will be able to remotely open the gates from their phone that is being called. That continues to be all we know as of this writing. Any update will be circulated via email and on Facebook. We still have clickers in stock for those that have not gotten one. \$20 check or money order made payable to Country Lakes for the deposit of each clicker.

Parking- There is no overnight parking allowed at the clubhouses or on any street. Steve White Towing has been authorized to patrol the communities at night and tow any violators. Hopefully this will discourage this practice.

Fuel Pump Skimming
Skimming occurs when devices illegally installed on ATMs, point-of-sale (POS) terminals, or fuel pumps capture data or record cardholders' PINs. Criminals use the data to create fake debit or credit cards and then steal from victims' accounts.

Tips When Using a Fuel Pump

- Choose a fuel pump that is **closer to the store** and in direct view of the attendant. These pumps are less likely to be targets for skimmers.
- **Run your debit card as a credit card.** If that's not an option, cover the keypad when you enter your PIN.
- **Consider paying inside** with the attendant, not outside at the pump.

If you think you've been a victim of skimming, contact your financial institution immediately.

RESIDENTS' ADVISORY BOARD TO ACCEPT APPLICATIONS FOR OPENINGS

The Advisory Board has a new chairperson. Dave Vossberg was appointed by Mr. Miller to replace Cheryl Koepke, who resigned last month.

The board is currently accepting applications for open board member positions. Four positions need to be filled (three two-year terms and one one-year term.). The decisions will be made by the board in early November. New board members will assume their duties at the November 12 board meeting.

Below are the questions which need to be answered and submitted to Dave Vossberg by November 1, 2024 to be considered for an open position.

Through the Advisory Board, resident issues are facilitated with Terry West, manager. A form has been created so that your concerns can be submitted in writing to any board member. Forms are available in both clubhouses and from any board member. (See Page 23) With Mr. Miller's approval, issues submitted to the board are those which affect more than one household. You are advised to deal individually with Terry West, manager, for personal issues.

The annual review of Rules and Regulations are done with the Resident Advisory Board. Other responsibilities include the revue and approval of social funds, the direction of improvements in the parks, along with other issues that may arise.

July 16 Meeting Updates:

The Advisory Board has adopted a new rule regarding its directors. A director may serve two two-year terms after which they must be off the board for one year before applying again. This is being done to promote diversity and transparency.

The Board met with Terry on Tuesday, July 16th addressing the following topics:

We would like an update on the gate installation: Chain link fence will be installed up to the gate at all entrances. The gate installation is being handled by MHM.

Are there cameras at the entrances and if so, are they operational? The recent theft of a golf cart from CLVI has heightened everyone's awareness of security: Yes, cameras are operational at all entrances.

We would like a trash receptacle in the area of the large Tiki hut and cornhole court. One will be placed in the Tiki hut area.


We would like the community to be more aware of the benefits of recycling. Can there be a recycling container near the mailboxes. Most of the contents of the trash can are likely paper from junk mail and therefore recyclable: A recycling container will be placed in the mailbox area of both CLVI and CLVII.

Ice machine in CLVI status and do all MHM properties use the same ice machine? If so possibly MHM could have a spare on hand to put in place when any of the community's machines go down. A repair part arrived yesterday (7-15-24) and is in the process of replacement. Upon repair it will be returned to CLVI.

The Advisory Board would like to once again request that the new gates be closed 24/7. The board is working directly with Bob Miller on this, we are in the process of creating a google survey which will contain pros and cons of gates being closed 24/7. This will go out to all residents of both communities when completed.

The results of the Advisory Board meetings are posted on the bulletin boards of both clubhouses in the area marked Advisory Board and will be updated each month.
