Manatee County Employees Visit

Visiting the April 2 Residents' Club meeting were Manatee County Employees, from left, Ian Burns, Code Enforcement; Manatee County Code Enforcement Officer Tami Campbell; shown center, CLVI Residents' Club co-chair Sue Meyer; Recycling Coordinator, Mary Oquendo; and Liz Holand, Code Enforcement Officer.

Campbell answered many of the questions pertaining to permitting required by Manatee County. Since the hurricanes resulted in damage to a lot of residences, questions have risen as to when a permit is necessary for repairs and the cost and procedure to acquire permitting if necessary. Campbell advised residents to call 3-1-1 for any permit requirement questions.

Campbell also advised that if the contractor does not obtain proper permitting, the homeowner will be responsible and there are large fines assessed to the failure of obtaining any required permits.

According to Oquendo, Manatee County will be distributing new 96 gallon garbage bins from mid-August to September. The county will begin using them on October 6 when garbage, yard waste and recycling will all be collected on the same day, once a week. Only contents of the new garbage bins and the recycling bins will be collected. Yard waste options: Plastic bags will no longer be an option for yard waste for curbside pickup or at the Lena Road Landfill. Alternatives to plastic bags include paper bags, reusable containers/cans or tied bundles.


