The sign will remain in the yards the entire month until the December winners are chosen. Those winners will be announced in January's newsletter.

**Mowing schedule** will be reduced to 2 times per month (every other week), December schedule is as follows: Thursday, Dec. 7 & Dec. 21 CLVII and Friday, Dec. 8 & Dec. 22, CLVI; January-March is still TBD but should be similar. Please keep in mind that if you have holiday yard décor, the mowers may skip you during that time to avoid damaging yard décor. Please keep large inflatables to a limit of 1 or 2 so as to not overdo. Lights are a great way to show your holiday spirit without overstating.

**Information for all LUX users,** any support issues, please call Lux Support at 877-589-3015,

**For all those returning** to the park from being away, check in with the office so we can update your current address. You can call, email or drop by to check in.

**All guests** must be registered with the office. Guests' stay must conform to the rules and be limited to no more than 15 consecutive days, no more than 30 per calendar year. If staying longer, December, 2023

the guests must be age qualified and screened by submitting an application to the office as state in the Community Rules.

**Dog owners** need to pick up their pet's droppings as soon as it happens, even if in your own yard. This is in the rules and is a good practice in helping to keep the park looking its best and to avoid spreading disease. **Cats must** be kept inside the home except when on a leash just as dogs must be leashed at all times if outside the home.

**Reminder** to mail your payments or have them mailed out in time to meet the deadline of "received on or before the 5th of each month." After the 5th, the \$40 late fee is added and if not paid by the 10th, after the 10th, a \$10 per day fee is ALSO added. This fee must be paid and will be subject to enforcement if not paid. Pay on time to avoid these fees as the office is doing the job the owner expects us to do and as the rules dictate.

Country Lakes Villages is a 55 plus community and it is important all residents and guests are identified prior to occupancy. See above "All quests." Rentals must be for 90 days or more and approved by the office prior to occupancy. Anyone not following this policy needs to be reported to the office as the safety of all the residents is paramount. Unapproved, back door rentals jeopardize the safety and welfare of all residents and won't be tolerated. But again, we have to be notified. I have successfully had several underage, unapproved occupants removed from the community with information from concerned residents. Also, I squashed an Air B&B with the help of neighbors. The safety and status as a 55 plus community hinges on residents complying with the rules of the community. Non-compliance will result in legal action and accompanying fees. My objective is to maximize your safety and the value of your home and the community.

**Homeowners are responsible** to maintain all bushes, plants and sod. The park mows, edges and weed eats. If you want a nice yard, it takes water, time and effort on the homeowner's part. Criticism that the park is mowing dust falls on the homeowner. Invest some time in your yard and the park will be mowing grass not dust.

**Yard statues**, figurines and ALL types of outside lawn or garden decorations must have the approval of community management before being set upon the lot. Quantity and size will be determined by the Community Manager. Most items will be permissible as long as they are in good taste. A recent incident involved a resident removing his decorations as they were deemed excessive by upper management. Many were outraged, while many agreed they were over the top. At any rate they were asked to be pared down. They opted to remove them all. Holiday decorations are welcome and there shouldn't be a problem in most cases. But before you purchase numerous, large decorations, you may want to get approval from management.

**RV's, Boats and Trailers** must have a current registration and be approved by the office. Failure to do so may result in towing. There are currently a few vehicles that aren't approved by the office or do not have current tags. After notification, I will have the vehicles towed if necessary. This free amenity is to be used for vehicles that are road worthy, not a storage place for useless junk.

Here's a quick reminder of some items to put in our Recycling bin after events in the clubhouse:

- >> Any item with food or liquid still in or on them

We now have a Blue Recycling Bin from Manatee County that is kept by the trash bins outside. Recycling from the Indoor Recycling bin will be deposited into the outdoor bin. The Park Maintenance Crew will move the bin out to be picked up when needed.

# Guidelines for CLVI Events (2023/2024 Season)

1. All indoor events at CLVI will have a designated maximum number of attendees, depending on the event. In order to properly plan for seating and food, all events will require a ticket for admittance.

2. <u>Residents</u> - The Host of the Event will keep a list of names of residents who receive tickets. There will be a \$10 deposit collected for each resident ticket. This \$10 deposit will be refunded at the event. If unable to attend the event, the resident must contact the host 4 or more hours prior to the starting time of the event for the \$10 deposit to be refunded.

3. <u>No-Show</u> - If a resident is a No-Show for the event, the deposit will be retained. All No-Show funds will be deposited into the appropriate Residents Club treasury fund.

4. <u>Guest and Residents of our sister park</u> - The Event Host will keep a waiting list of names of Guests and Residents of our "sister park" who are interested in attending the event. If there are tickets still available one week prior to the event, tickets will be made available to people on the waiting list. A \$10 non-refundable charge will be collected from all non-resident Guests.

5. <u>Walk Ins</u> - Residents who show up at the event without a ticket <u>may not</u> be seated upon arrival. They will be asked to wait until 5 minutes before the event begins to see if there are open seats due to No-Shows. If there are open seats, they can be seated. A \$10 deposit will not be collected from these attendees.

6. Guests and Residents of our "sister park" who walk into the event without a ticket and are able to be seated will be charged \$10.

All events will be open seating with no reserved or saved tables or chairs.
