1 c. oil	2 tsp. vanilla
1 c. brown sugar	1 tsp. salt
1 c. white sugar	4 & 1/2 c. flour
2 eggs	12 ozs. chocolate chips
2 tsp. baking soda	

Stir together flour, soda and salt. Set aside. Beat butter and oil. Add both sugars and beat until fluffy. Add eggs, vanilla. Beat well. Add dry ingredients. Stir in chips. Drop by teaspoonsful onto greased cookie sheet. Bake 8 to 10 minutes in 375 degree oven. Enjoy!

- <u>Residents</u> The Host of the Event will keep a list of names of residents who receive tickets. There will be a \$10 deposit collected for each resident ticket. This \$10 deposit will be refunded at the event. If unable to attend the event, the resident must contact the host 4 or more hours prior to the starting time of the event for the \$10 deposit to be refunded.
- 3. <u>No-Show</u> If a resident is a No-Show for the event, the deposit will be retained. All No-Show funds will be deposited into the appropriate Residents Club treasury fund.
- 4. <u>Guest and Residents of our sister park</u> The Event Host will keep a waiting list of names of Guests and Residents of our "sister park" who are interested in attending the event. If there are tickets still available two weeks prior to the event, tickets will be made available to people on the waiting list. A \$10 non-refundable charge will be collected from all non-resident Guests.
- 5. <u>Walk Ins</u> Residents who show up at the event without a ticket <u>may not</u> be seated upon arrival. They will be asked to wait until 5 minutes before the event begins to see if there are open seats due to No-Shows. If there are open seats, they can be seated. A \$10 deposit will not be collected from these attendees.
- 6. Guests and Residents of our "sister park" who walk into the event without a ticket and are able to be seated will be charged \$10.

- >> Box board, like cereal and cracker boxed
- >> Cardboard (if broken down)
- >> Empty Glass bottles and jars
- >> Empty Aluminum and steel cans

>> Empty Plastic bottles/containers (with no food residual)

>> Empty Milk and Juice cartons

Please <u>Do Not</u> put these common kitchen items in Recycling:

- >> Garbage
- >> Plastic Bags or tablecloths
- >> Styrofoam
- >> Sandwich bags, Saran Wrap, Shrink Wrap
- >> Any item with food or liquid still in or on them

We now have a Blue Recycling Bin from Manatee County that is kept by the trash bins outside. Recycling from the Indoor Recycling bin will be deposited into the outdoor bin. The Park Maintenance Crew will move the bin out to be picked up when needed.

Thank you for your cooperation with this renewed effort. Let's see how much Recycling we can do in order to reduce the trash in our Landfills!

In the north New Year's tradition is pork and sauerkraut for luck in the coming year. Germans have been eating pork and sauerkraut on New Year's Day for generations because they believe it brings good luck (viel glück in German). As these kraut lovers immigrated to the Midwest, they brought their traditions with them, including this one.

Most popular resolutions are to lose weight, to exercise more, eat healthier, personal growth, get a new job, spend more time with family, learn a new skill, learn a new hobby, drink less alcohol, and stop smoking.




