Gate Update: We have not been given a date yet when they will be operational but hopefully we will in the in the near future. As of now, they will be open during the day just like the old gates were. There will be the ability to enter a 4-digit code at the 2 main entry points if you do not have your clicker. The 4 digit is your lot number. If you have a 3-digit lot number then add a zero in front. EXAMPLE- Lot 200 = 0200. This information should NOT be given out to anyone that is NOT a resident. Visitors will be able to find the person they are looking for in the call box directory that will be located at the main entrance to each park and call them on that call box. When the resident picks up, they will be able to remotely open the gates from their phone that is being called. That continues to be all we know as of this writing. Any update will be circulated via email & on Facebook. We still have clickers in stock for those that have not gotten one. \$20 check or money order made payable to Country Lakes for the deposit of each clicker.

Speed limit: Please drive slowly thru the communities- Our streets in the parks are not a thoroughfare. It is private property and speed limit signs are posted everywhere- PLEASE OBSERVE THE 15 MPH LIMIT FOR SAFETY OF ALL. Also please DO NOT cut thru the community clubhouse lots to cut off a few seconds. There are always people milling about so if not going to the community clubhouse specifically, please avoid the lots.

Inoperative vehicles: Per current rules effective March 1, 2022 "No junk, inoperative or unlicensed vehicles may be used or parked in the community at any time." Owners will be given a 24 hour notice for removal prior to it being towed at their expense.

Pet Owners: Make sure to obey all rules regarding pets including "do not walk your pet on any other Homeowners lot or in the amenity areas." Dog parks are provided or use your own lot but pick up immediately after your pet.

Free Yoga! pick up your pet waste. Call it Downward-Dog. (Sign inserted by Editor who thinks it's cute)

Yards and homes: Please make arrangements to have your home cleaned and beds weeded as summer means mold and weeds. Failure to do will result in a 14 day notice to cure the problem, followed by staff doing the work and your account being charged if not done in a timely manner. I'd rather the residents do the work.

Business: No Business or commercial enterprises shall be permitted to be operated by any resident or any guest or invitee of any resident from or within the community. No Pop-Up Restaurants!

Refuse: Garbage or yard waste may not be placed on the street any earlier than 4 p.m. the night before scheduled pick up. Violations of this rule has resulted in Country Lakes staff removing the items and charging the resident. The intent is to minimize the amount of time we have to look at trash or refuse.

Cleanliness: It is important that your lot and home be free of debris. Refuse containers including 1 recycle and 1 refuse, bicycles and grills must be left on the carport (any other location for placement or storage requires advance written permission of Community Management); all other items, containers, or equipment will be placed out of sight. All items not approved to be stored outside the home, carport or porch must be stored in the home's shed or in the home itself. It is hurricane season, so anything that could become a projectile needs to be stored or secured for the safety of all.

RESIDENTS' ADVISORY BOARD TO ACCEPT APPLICATIONS FOR OPENINGS

The Advisory Board has a new chairperson. Dave Vossberg was appointed by Mr. Miller to replace Cheryl Koepke, who resigned last month.

The board is currently accepting applications for open board member positions. Four positions need to be filled (three two-year terms and one one-year term.). The decisions will be made by the board in early November. New board members will assume their duties at the November 12 board meeting.

Bob Miller, owner of Country Lakes Villages, has an Advisory Board in place, comprised of residents from both parks: CLVI-Sandy Gilbertson, Sue Eckert and Bruce Steltzer; CLVII-Sue Dibble, Laura Reynolds and Bree Borders with Dave Vossberg, Chairperson. The Advisory Board handles certain responsibilities until such time that these responsibilities can be undertaken by the HOAs in each community. Mr. Miller will determine when that transition can take place. This has not happened as yet.

Through the Advisory Board, resident issues are facilitated with Terry West, manager. A form has been created so that your concerns can be submitted in writing to any board member. Forms are available in both clubhouses and from any board member. (See Page 23) With Mr. Miller's approval, issues submitted to the board are those which affect more than one household. You are advised to deal individually with Terry West, manager, for personal issues.

The annual review of Rules and Regulations are done with the Resident Advisory Board. Other responsibilities include the revue and approval of social funds, the direction of improvements in the parks, along with other issues that may arise.

The Advisory Board has adopted a new rule regarding its directors. A director may serve two two-year terms after which they must be off the board for one year before applying again. This is being done to promote diversity and transparency.

We will be meeting with Terry on Wednesday, June 19 with the intent of addressing the following topics:

We would like an update on the gate installation. Some areas of the installation have allowed puddles to form.

We would like to know who monitors the contractors. Is this done by Terry or someone within the MHM organization?

We would like Terry to share up-to-date info on repairs that affect residents. For example, in CLVI, the ice maker is broken and one of the lake fountains is down again.

There is, once again, concern about lake erosion. Residents are losing space in their yards, and some spots are deemed dangerous. What are the long-range plans to deal with this?

There are 19 houses for sale, 1 house for rent and 1 sale pending.



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

Romance scams occur when a criminal adopts a fake online identity to gain a victim's affection and trust. The scammer then uses the illusion of a romantic or close relationship to manipulate and/or steal from the victim.

The scammer's intention is to establish a relationship as quickly as possible, endear himself to the victim, and gain trust. Scammers may propose marriage and make plans to meet in person, but that will never happen. Eventually, they will ask for money.

If someone you meet online needs your bank account information to deposit money, they are most likely using your account to carry out other theft and fraud schemes

Tips for Avoiding Romance Scams:

- Be careful what you post and make public online. Scammers can use
 details shared on social media and dating sites to better understand
 and target you.
- Research the person's photo and profile using online searches to see if the image, name, or details have been used elsewhere.
- Go slowly and ask lots of questions.
- Beware if the individual seems too perfect or quickly asks you to leave a dating service or social media site to communicate directly.
- Beware if the individual attempts to isolate you from friends and family or requests inappropriate photos or financial information that could later be used to extort you.
- Beware if the individual promises to meet in person but then always comes up with an excuse why he or she can't. If you haven't met the person after a few months, for whatever reason, you have good reason to be suspicious.
- Never send money to anyone you have only communicated with online or by phone.





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
