

I will be sending 14-day notices to remedy this and if it isn't, I will hire our lawn service to weed and trim and their fee will be due pursuant to the community rules and regulations. Non-payment will result in enforcement action as well as resulting legal fees, if needed.

My objective is to maximize the aesthetics for the community as a whole. Maintain your home and lot to avoid the enforcement action, pursuant to Chapter 723 and the rules you agreed to when you signed the community lease. CLVII has a young lady that is doing a great job maintaining lots and homes. If you'd like her name, call the office and we will give you her contact information. She will try her best to fit you into her already busy schedule.

Occupants must be registered and approved by the office. It is paramount we know who is living in the

community at all time. Verification of age, background checks and notification of pets are all essential factors and we must have that information on file pursuant to the rules and regulations for the communities. I have recently been informed of three lots with unapproved and/or underage occupants. One has been referred to the attorney for enforcement and two have been noticed and enforcement action will commence, if needed. I encourage you to report this information, so I can enforce the rule. Written notification to this office is essential for the enforcement action, and all reports of any non-compliance are kept confidential (no names are given as to who told us).


Dear Fellow Residents,



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
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


Pool Exercise
