Here we are in August already, lucky for us, we have a lot of warm weather yet to come this year.

If you are out of town and have friends or family planning to stay at your home here at CLVII, please let the office know in advance. Please let your visitors know they are to check in at the office, not to give them a hard time, but to welcome them to our community. We need to have a record of who is staying in your home when you are not present.

I have heard some complaints about our ice machine not being sanitary. I emailed Katie with your concerns and this is her reply. 'The ice machine gets cleaned routinely, and the filters are changed routinely. Filters are changed by the guys, and Bonnie cleans the machine. I, "Katie," inspect after each monthly cleaning and have not seen any issues. The ice machine gets completely dumped/drained and disinfected, the exterior has been power washed, and gets wiped with disinfectant/stainless cleaner.' So, there you have it, it is sanitary and safe to use.

Tree work is not complete in CLVII". If you have an oak tree that has not been serviced during this round, you will be included in the second round of tree work.

A new sound system for the clubhouse has been approved. Management is currently working on estimates. Please take your time when you are going through the gates, they weren't even working for a week when a resident hit the exit gate. They are now working, so be patient and give the gates the time needed to open on their own.

Light posts have always been the residents' responsibility. Please make sure your bulbs are not burned out and replace them as needed. If your light post needs to be replaced, contact the office first. They have the new posts on order, and they will let you know when they are in stock.

There was a palm tree hit by lightning in the clubhouse parking lot, which is why the lights in the parking

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

- 1. August was originally called "Sextilis" in the Roman calendar, as it was the sixth month of their year.
- 2. The month was renamed "Augustus" in 8 BCE to honor Roman Emperor Augustus Caesar.
- 3. Augustus chose this month because it was the time of several of his great triumphs, including the conquest of Egypt.
- In the early Roman calendar, August had only 29 days. Augustus added two days to make it equal to July, which was named after Julius Caesar.
- 5. The Anglo-Saxons called August "Weod monath," meaning "weed month," due to the rapid growth of plants during this time.

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Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit

- ☐ Water and non-perishable food for several days
- ☐ Extra cell phone battery or charger
- ☐ Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries
- ☐ Flashlight and extra batteries
- ☐ First aid kit
- ☐ Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- ☐ Whistle to signal for help
- ☐ Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ☐ Can opener (if kit contains canned food)
- ☐ Local maps



Additional Items to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:

- ☐ Prescription medications and glasses
- ☐ Infant formula and diapers
- ☐ Pet food, water and supplies for your pet
- ☐ Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a portable waterproof container
- ☐ Cash and change
- ☐ Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from www.ready.gov
- ☐ Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person.
- ☐ Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes.
- ☐ Fire Extinguisher Matches in a waterproof container Feminine supplies, personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer
- ☐ Mess kits, Paper cups, plates and disposable utensils, paper towels
- ☐ Paper and pencil Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
