



#### FROM THE MANAGEMENT

#### **Reminders from the Managers Desk**

- CONGRATULATIONS TO THE VERY 1ST HOMES OF THE MONTH -NOVEMBER 2023! Rest assured the judging was done by others that would be impartial, not by staff of Country Lakes. Please see photos on page 17.
- The Winners are: CLV1- #505 Bill & Cheryl Pearce; & CLV2 - #2137 Rick & Donna Hinton. Congrats to both winners. Remember this will be an ongoing contest so there is still plenty of time to be chosen to be future Home of the Month winners. You will be seeing the signs in the yards of the winners. The sign will remain in the yard the entire month until December's winners are chosen. Those winners will be announced in January's Newsletter.
- Mowing schedule will be reduced to two times per month (every other week), December Schedule is as follows: Thurs Dec 7 CLV2 & Fri Dec 8th CLV1; And Thurs Dec 21st CLV2 & Fri Dec 22nd CLV1. Jan-March is still TBD but should be similar. Please keep in mind that if you have holiday yard décor the mowers may skip you during that time to avoid damaging yard

décor. Please keep large inflatables to a limit of 1 or 2 to not overdo. Lights are a great way to show your holiday spirit without overstating.

- Information for all Lux users, any support issues please call Lux Support at 877-589-3015
- For all of you that are now returning to the park after being away, please remember to check in with the office so we can update the address where you are. You can call, email, or drop by to check in.
- All guests must be registered with the office. Guests must conform to the rules and be limited to no more than 15 consecutive days at a time and no more than 30 days per calendar year. If staying longer the guests must be age-qualified and screened by applying to the office as stated in the Community Rules as well.
- Dog owners need to pick up their own pet's droppings as soon as it happens, this includes in your own yard. This is in the rules and is good practice in helping to keep the park looking its best and to avoid spreading disease. Cats must be kept inside the home except when on a leash. Dogs must always be leashed if outside the home.
- Reminder to mail your payments or have them mailed out in time to meet the deadline of received on or before the 5th of each month. After the 5th, the \$40 late fee is added and if not paid by the 10th, a \$10 per day fee is also added. This fee must be paid and will subject you to enforcement if not paid. Pay on time to avoid this fee as the office is doing the job the owner expects us to do and as the rules dictate.
- Country Lakes Villages is a 55 plus

community and it is important all residents and guests are identified prior to occupancy. Guests must register with the office and can stay for 15 consecutive days and no more than 30 per year. Guests staying longer must be age qualified and screened. Rentals must be for 90 days or more and approved by the office prior to occupancy. Anyone not following this policy should be reported to the office as the safety of all the residents is paramount. Unapproved back door rentals jeopardize the safety and welfare of all residents and won't be tolerated. But again, we must be notified. I have successfully had several unapproved underage, occupants removed from the community with information from concerned residents. Also, I squashed an Air B&B with the help of neighbors. The safety and status as a 55 plus community hinges on residents complying with the rules of the community. Non-compliance will result in legal action and accompanying fees. My objective is to maximize your safety and the value of your home and the community.

- Homeowners are responsible for maintaining all bushes, plants, and sod. The park mows, edges and weed eats. If you want a nice yard it takes water, time, and effort on the homeowner's part. Criticism that the park is mowing dust falls on the homeowner. Invest some time in your yard and the park will be mowing grass, not dust.
- Yard statues, figurines, and ALL types of outside lawn or garden decorations must have the approval of community management before being set up on the lot. Quantity and size will be determined by the Community Manager. Most

items will be permissible if they are in good taste. A recent incident involved a resident removing his decorations as they were deemed excessive by upper management. Many were outraged, while many agreed they were over the top. At any rate, they were asked to be pared down, they opted to remove them all. Holiday decorations are welcome and there shouldn't be a problem in most cases. But before you purchase numerous, large decorations you may want to get approval from management.

RV's, Boats and trailers must have a current registration and be approved by the office when parked in the RV lot. Failure to do so may result in towing. There are currently a few vehicles that aren't approved by the office or have a current tag. After notification, I will have the vehicles towed, if necessary. This free amenity is to be used for vehicles that are road worthy, not a storage place for useless junk.

We really do need at least 1 or 2 volunteers to take this job on for the community. The library is such a wonderful place to have available to our residents. Now-a-days, most people read via the internet or Kindle, but some still love the feel of having that book in their hands and reading. Please let the RAC know if you would like to give this opportunity a chance.

This is the time of year when scammers are at their best trying to get your money or personal information.

#### Here are some tips to help you not get scammed:

- Slow down and be cautious of urgent or unusual requests. This includes via email, text, and in-person attempts to gain private information from you.
- Pay attention to subtle differences (like • typos) in email addresses and URLs. When in doubt, retype the proper address yourself.
- Never share confidential information like login IDs, verification codes or passwords.
- Never click on suspicious or unknown links.
- Ignore unsolicited calls, emails, and texts.
- Watch out for any kind of requests for payment: verify requests by contacting service providers directly using known and trusted contact information.

When in doubt please contact a neighbor, friend or family member and make sure you are not opening yourself up to a scammer to defraud you.

#### ADVISORY BOARD & TERRY WEST Q&A

This meeting was conducted on 10/18/23 at 9am.

1. Are there plans to replace the rest of the blinds in CLVI?

Terry was not aware they needed to be replaced. He will look at the situation.

2. In CLVII, the blind in the exercise room is sagging in the middle. Please replace it with a different type or find a way to repair it.

Once again, Terry was unaware of this issue; he will look into it.

**3.** The Hot Tub in both parks needs massive updating or replacement.

Terry is currently working on this issue. He has a meeting scheduled with someone who can refinish the interior of the hot tubs.

### 4. Smoking areas in both parks need to look Advisory Board. decent.

Terry is aware that these areas are not attractive. He is making changes so they will look better. However, residents continue to add things which degrade the appearance of the areas.

### 5. Does Mr. Miller know about the pool leak in CLVII?

Mr. Miller is aware of the pool leak in CLV 2. Part of the equipment is going to have to be removed and replaced. Terry continues to work to find a company that will do this.

## 6. The fountain by the pool in CLVI hasn't been moved. The extended deck will make problems worse.

Terry has been made aware of this problem in the past. He has ordered an extension cord of 100 feet which is the maximum that is available. Once it is here the fountain will be moved away from the pool deck.

Terry added that we need a warming oven in both clubhouses to accommodate catered meals. Cheryl will discuss this with Mr. Miller.

Terry stated that owners are responding to the notices regarding yard cleanup. He is charging those for whom our staff must complete the work.

Cheryl Koepke will normally wait for approval from both Terry and the board member who accompanied her before she posts these items in the clubhouse. Once approved, they will be posted in both clubhouses and posted in the following month's Village Voice.

The new advisory board member is Laura Reynolds from CLVII.
