Clarification to the November HOA article in the Village Voice. In the November Village Voice, I made a statement that 'if there are any questions



about the about the 2026 8.3% rent increase or market value, please contact Katie.' This increase was only for those leaseholders who were not former shareholders. The shareholder's rent is based on the contract they signed with the sale of the community, and the HOA has no input and cannot make any announcement about their rent increases. I am sorry for any confusion my statement about the 2026 8.3% rent increase in the November Village Voice article may have caused.

Here we are, the last month of the year, and the busiest month of the year. Most of our northerners are back, and many were at our HOA meeting. It is good to see such a nice turnout. Deb went over the final fix in our bylaws. It states that the Homeowners committee can be formed in one of two ways: by a vote of the majority of the affected homeowners in the community or by being appointed by the HOA board. The Bylaws will be signed and filed with Manatee County, then a copy will be emailed to everyone in the near future, and it will be posted on the clubhouse bulletin board. We discussed the front exit gate being locked open in the daytime, and with a show of hands, the majority showed to leave them closed as they currently are intended to help control outgoing traffic and ensure safety with vehicles having to slow down on exiting the community. The major work with Blue Stream, putting in the big fiber optic lines, is almost complete. There will be many more updates to come from the office, so stay tuned; they will be on Facebook and through email. Please share information with anyone you know who may not have email or Facebook. Linda Weber and Bob Moriarty both have HOA membership cards. For anyone interested in joining, it is \$10.00, and you can contact either of them. They will not be going door to door this year, although they will deliver your membership cards to your home if asked. If you want to become a member for 2026, join before it closes; the cut-off is March 31, 2026.



Jay Pinkley will be leaving the red bin for the F.E.L.T. donations in the clubhouse for an extended period of time. Please donate generously to this great cause.




FUN FACT

- Christmas wasn't always on December 25.
 Although Christmas celebrates the birth of Christ, it doesn't actually mention December 25 anywhere in the Bible. In fact, some historians think Jesus was born in the spring, not in the winter at all! Christmas on December 25th wasn't celebrated until about 336 AD.
- 2. Evergreens are an ancient tradition. The iconic Christmas tree has a lot of roots (forgive the pun). Ancient Egyptians used to mark the winter solstice by decorating their homes with green palms, while the Romans celebrated Saturnalia with evergreen boughs. These green plants signified that the spring would return with new life. The first Christmas trees, as we know them today, started in Germany in the 16th century.
- 3. St. Nick was more generous than jolly. The original Santa Claus was actually St. Nicholas, a Christian bishop in the 4th century. He didn't wear the red suit that's so famous today, but he did give all of his inheritance to the poor and needy. In Dutch, his name is Sinter Klaas, which later morphed into Santa Claus.
- 4. Coca-Cola played a part in Santa's image. Santa wasn't always the jolly man in red. Older depictions of Santa from the early 1900s depicted him more sternly, and there wasn't a standardized "look" for his appearance. The classic image of a happy and plump Santa that we all know today came in part from Coca-Cola ads, drawn in 1931 by illustrator Haddon Sundblom.
- 5. Hanging stockings started by accident. The historic St. Nicholas heard about the plight of a local man who did not have enough dowry money to marry off his three daughters. The generous St. Nick tossed some money down the chimney that landed in the ladies' stockings that were drying by the fire. After that, the tradition stuck!
