Happy New Year, Everyone! Here we are in 2026 already. It seems the older I get, the faster time goes. It was a great year, we survived with no hurricane, just like old times. We lost a few residents again last year, some were original residents of this community from 1987, and they will be missed by many. We have a lot of new residents—let's ensure they feel welcome in our friendly community. We had a great meeting in December, with many new faces in attendance. It's encouraging to see our community continue to grow. The members of the HOA board determined that the current board members will continue with their positions for the 2026 year.



All residents received a tax notice that was explained at the meeting. There will be a \$5.43 amount added to the initial 90-Day notice that showed the tax amount due monthly as \$125.70. The new amount of monthly taxes will actually be \$131.13 based on the final tax bill received from Manatee County. There will be a one-time payment due to the office by March 1 of \$65.13. If you have any questions, please contact me, and I will be happy to go over this with you. The renegotiated Blue Stream internet monthly fee will be \$50.00 per month. Those who are currently opt-out residents will begin paying the \$50.00 fee once Blue Stream is live within the entire community. The HOA has been made aware that, per the Florida Statutes 723, the HOA meetings are homeowner meetings. Renters are not homeowners and therefore should not be attending our HOA meetings. The Village Voice has two calendars each month. One for the current month and one for the next month. If you remove these from the newsletter and put them on your refrigerator, you will always know what is happening in the community. Along the right side of the calendar, there is a list of Daily Events. This provides residents with all the events that happen daily in our community. There is also a poster in the Village Voice listing all Social Committee events for the next 6 months. Just by checking the monthly Village Voice, you should always be aware of all the great events offered to all residents of our community.

Tree Trimming

Oaks will be trimmed during the first two weeks of January. An arborist will determine which oaks require trimming and will create the list directly. Residents do not need to contact the office regarding trees — the arborist will handle the assessments independently.

Oaks are trimmed twice per year, and the next trimming will occur later in the year.

Palm trees are also trimmed twice per year. Their next trimming will be scheduled in the coming months.

Residents are responsible for trimming any other trees that are not oaks or the taller palms.





Felts Audubon Preserve – This property was once used by Otis Felts for grazing cattle. Upon his passing, this 28-acre property was donated to Manatee County Audubon so it would remain undeveloped. The Audubon Society has documented over 194 avian species, including the Great Horned Owl, Pileated Woodpecker, Thrushes, Warblers, Herons, Egrets, and the sought-after Indigo and Painted Buntings. The bird blind provides visitors with an excellent opportunity for close-up viewing and photography of the birds. Winter is the best time for viewing many of the migratory birds in our area. The Felts Audubon Preserve is located at 4600 24th Avenue E., Palmetto. Because it is a bird sanctuary, no pets are allowed.


Perico Preserve – Need a place to get away and take a relaxing stroll? Perico Preserve, 11700 Manatee Ave W, Bradenton, is your place. Perico Preserve is a stone's throw away from Anna Maria Island, but a million miles from all the hustle and bustle. Bird watching is a favorite activity at this preserve, but the easy walkways, boardwalks, and bike trails make it an experience for everyone. With just over a mile of groomed trails, this preserve is great for anyone.

Conservatory Park – I just love preserves that are set aside to enjoy nature right in the center of a bustling city! Conservatory Park is that place. Most of the trails are paved, and they have plenty of areas to sit and relax and just listen to the peace and quiet that surrounds you. I saw my first wild owl there. So bring your binoculars and your pet (they are welcome here) and take a leisurely stroll or relax at one of their picnic areas. This is a very well-maintained park with beautiful gardens, clean restrooms and even an observation platform for seeing many, and I mean many, turtles in the pond! Conservatory Park is located at 8027 Conservatory Park Drive, Sarasota. They have a couple of entrances, so pick the one that is best for you.

Duette Preserve – For those of you who are more hardy hikers or bikers, you can't go wrong with a visit to Duette Preserve. With over 21,000 acres, the Preserve is the largest Preserve in Manatee County and is the headwaters of the Manatee River. There is a wide variety of game animals, including the burrowing owl, snowy egret, gopher tortoise, deer, wild hogs, and they have even spotted a Florida panther on one of the trail cameras. The trails are hard-shell surfaced for the most part, which makes it easy for bikers and electric bikes. They do allow vehicles on some trails, but you must get a permit to take your car in the preserve. They offer several tours during the year, and I'll post on Facebook when I see any coming up. The park has several entrances, so it is best to go to their webpage to see the location you would like to go to. Their address is 2649 Rawls Road, Duette.




