Hello everyone, May is here already. The weather has been great for us, although I hear from our northern folks it is still bitterly cold up there. I will take this weather any day.

At our March FMO meeting, we discovered that Meals on Wheels Plus is more than just someone who delivers food to help residents. They have food banks where you can shop for food and places where you can safely meet other people. We have left pamphlets for the food bank locations that are available for any resident who wants to pick one up, or if you just want more information about this great Manatee County option. They are in the clubhouse on the HOA section of the bulletin board.

At the FMO meeting on April 8th, we were told that bills 701 and 1714 both passed, and we are now waiting for both bills to go to Gov. Ron DeSantis' desk. We are getting very positive feedback, and hopefully it will be signed into law in July. This will have a positive impact on quite a few of our qualifying residents in our community to help lower the rent.

We continue to receive many complaints about speeding in the community. This includes golf carts as well. Please tell your family members about the 15 MPH speed limit in the community. Many residents have golf carts that can go much faster than the posted speed limit, and you need to keep your speed at no more than the speed limit. Also, stop signs should be adhered to throughout the community by both cars and golf carts.

If you find anyone, including delivery drivers, not stopping at the stop signs or keeping to the speed limit, contact Katie and provide the street and time, and she can look it up, and we can issue a warning.

If you are looking for information on Facebook about our community, be sure that you are on the correct page, which is (Residents of Country Lakes Villages Community Forum). This page is the only place to find the correct information about CLVI and CLVII. This is where Katie will post everything about our community. Admins for any Facebook pages that are not watched by the office should ensure that the rules for the




Attention CLVII residents. Did you know we have internal mailboxes in the Clubhouse? They are on the






