### SOCIAL/FUN COMMITTEE

### **Social Committee:**

Hope everyone is having a great summer. There has been a



lot of talk and misunderstandings about the Social Committee and the old RAC. At the August 6th HOA meeting, the Social Committee presented a discussion on this very subject. So, to try and clear up any questions or concerns, we provided a summary of what happened to get from the RAC to the Social Committee.

We had a RAC for a long time, even before the CO-OP was formed. The people who owned the park before the CO-OP was formed did not provide money for events. The RAC worked as a business at that time, and even when the CO-OP was formed. Because we sold tickets, we had to pay taxes. People volunteered to host an event and had forms and receipts for each event to support the expenses and to show a profit or loss. Therefore, the RAC had a business account. A business account requires a fee and must be registered with the state.

When Miller took over and provided the monies for events, we no longer "sell" tickets to cover the expenses. Therefore, we are not eligible to have a business account because we are not functioning as a business any longer. The only account we could get would have to be in someone's name, and the money would show as income to the IRS. The best choice for us to function was to disband RAC and become the Social Committee, using the HOA's business EIN to open an account. This was voted on by the committee members and approved by all members.

There is no longer a RAC, and the Social Committee is only responsible for the money Miller provides. We do not report to the HOA, and they have no access to the banking account. The Social Committee reports to the Advisory Board and the park office. We prepare a budget for the following year for approval from the Advisory Board and submit the reimbursement forms with all receipts to

the park office. When the check is ready someone from the committee picks it up and deposits it in the Social Committee account.

As a RAC we were running the 50/50. We found out that the Social Committee could not make money off Miller's money. So, the function of 50/50 has been moved to the HOA. The Social Committee has nothing to do with the 50/50 anymore. The Social Committee is a standalone and only deals with the money Mr. Miller provides for events. Included in the events are dances, dinners, Saturday coffee hour, and the Ice Cream Social. This does not include the events particular residents wanted to have available, such as darts, pickleball, Feather Your Nest, card games, etc. If you need things like pickle balls, dart boards, etc., check with the office. They have a separate account for things like that and may be able to assist in providing those items.

Another issue that has come up is the clubhouse building and decorating, etc. We were buying pictures and decorations for the walls with Mr. Miller's money and hanging such items up, putting holes in the walls, etc. This building belongs to Mr. Miller, not us. Therefore, we should not have been doing this. The office must keep an inventory of everything in the clubhouse, for example, tables, chairs, fixtures, pictures on the walls, and appliances. While the decorations we were putting up are beautiful, they belong to Miller, and when we take some down, etc., it messes up the inventory for the office. People forget that we do not own the clubhouse, or how it would feel if someone came into your home and started redecorating.

The Social Committee has been busy writing up procedures and duties of the committee for events and such. We have prepared a sheet to describe what must be done for the events, in the hope that it will encourage others to volunteer for duties. This is also being done to help ensure that one person is not always responsible for everything that needs to be done for events. If the tasks are broken into small tasks, it is not so overwhelming. We had some good

discussions about some ideas for future events and ways we can maximize the money provided by Mr. Miller for community events.

The Funky Monkey dance on the 2nd of August was enjoyed by many. In the summer, there are fewer people around, so we invited CLVI to join us. We can only do this due to capacity issues for summer dances. We are charged the same if twenty people are attending or if fifty people are attending. It was a great turnout, and the band was terrific! A lot of fun was had by all.

### **MIDGE VIRTUE-VINSON, 1929-2025**

After a lifetime of facing challenges with resilience and grace, Mildred Mae Phillips Virtue-Vinson, age 96, of McCordsville, IN, died on July 31 after a short illness.

She was born in 1929 on the cusp of the Great Depression to Carey Phillips and Edna Vanaman. She grew up on a farm without electricity or indoor plumbing, wearing clothes made from feed sacks but with abundant food and plenty of siblings. When a young Gl, James Andrew Virtue, came to teach at her school, she caught his eye and reinvented herself into the teacher's wife.

She had three children before she learned to drive. After the third, she got her drivers license and a job. That began a long odyssey of success in kitchen management, teaching in vocational schools, and sales.

Together Jim and Mildred had four children, John (Sharon), Robert (Judy), Betty Moore (Roger) and Janice (Dwight Deuring). Jim died when she was 48 and she kept right on, making a way for her family which grew to include grandchildren Kelly White, Brian Moore and Anne Virtue. She was blessed with a second nine-year marriage to John Kuehnle Vinson



with whom she began traveling to Florida for the winter season and making lifetime friends at Country Lakes Village. In the last two years she enjoyed the company of new friends at Traditions at Brookside.

Throughout the years, she might have been referred to as a cake decorator, investor, tennis champ, house flipper, flower whisperer, antique hunter, bluebird mom, family cooking consultant, and inventor of the family games tradition. All of her children, grandchildren and now great grandchildren Avery and Sam White, Blakely and Brody Moore, and Emmett and

August Wilson, know that no family gathering is finished until the games have been played.

Midge was preceded in death by her husbands Jim and John, her son Rob, her parents and siblings Chester, Howard, Helen, James and Ruby, who was also her best friend. She leaves her brother Wayne to carry on the family legacy.

Midge asked that there be no memorial service. Instead, she asked that you watch for the bluebirds and remember her. You can honor her memory by donations to your favorite nature or wildlife organization.





- 1. The idea first became public in 1882. In September 1882, the unions of New York City decided to have a parade to celebrate their members being in unions and to show support for all unions. At least 20,000 people were there, and the workers had to give up a day's pay to attend. There was also a lot of beer involved in the event.
- 2. The New York parade inspired other unions. Other regions started having parades, and by 1887, Oregon, Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, and Colorado made Labor Day a state holiday.
- 3. How did the Haymarket Affair influence Labor Day? On May 4, 1886, a bomb exploded at a union rally in Chicago's Haymarket Square, which led to violence that killed seven police officers and four others. The incident also led to May 1 being celebrated in most nations as Workers' Day. The U.S. government chose Labor Day instead to avoid a celebration on May 1, and New York's unions had already

- picked the first Monday in September for their holiday.
- 4. Two people with similar names are credited with that first New York City event. Matthew Maguire, a machinist, and Peter McGuire, a carpenter, have been linked to the 1882 parade. The men were from rival unions; in 2011, Linda Stinson, a former U.S. Department of Labor historian, said she did not know which man should be credited partially because people over the years had confused them because of their similar-sounding names.
- 5. Grover Cleveland helped make Labor Day a national holiday. After violence related to the Pullman railroad strike, President Cleveland and lawmakers in Washington wanted a federal holiday to celebrate labor, and not a holiday celebrated on May 1. Cleveland signed an act in 1894 establishing the federal holiday; most states had already passed laws establishing a Labor Day holiday by that point. Sen. James Henderson Kyle of South Dakota introduced S. 730 to make Labor Day a federal legal holiday on the first Monday of September. It was approved on June 28, 1894.
