Deputy Warren has been employed by the Manatee County Sheriff's Office for 21 years. In that time he has worked undercover for 10 years, a year in the burglary unit and five-and-a-half years in the homicide unit until coming to the Crime Prevention Unit. He said that his boss, "Sheriff Rick Wells is all about customer service to keep you safe."

Several of those programs offered by the Sheriff's Office are being or has been implemented here in CLVI which include the Bicycle Registration and the Combat Auto Theft (C.A.T.) program. Sign-up sheets are on the clubhouse bulletin board. Deputy Warren will also be providing Jennettie with information on a possible Health Fair next season.

For all of you that are now getting ready to leave the park for the summer, remember to complete and turn in the checkout form that is available at the office inside and outside for your convenience. You can email or drop by to check out or in with the form.

All guests must be registered with the office. Guests stay must conform to the rules and be limited to no more than 15 consecutive days at a time, no more than 30 per calendar year. If staying longer, the guests must be age qualified and screened by submitting an application to the office as stated in the Community Rules. This applies to ALL seasonal renters as well. Homeowners found to be in violation will be sent to legal and fees will be added once the notice is posted from legal.

I will be evaluating the CLVI RV Storage area in 2024. **RV's, boats and/or trailers can only be parked in the RV storage area and must have a current DMV registration as well as approval from the office.** Failure to do so may result in towing. There are currently a few vehicles that aren't approved by the office or do not have a current tag. This area is an amenity to store useful RV's, boats and trailers that are functional and road worthy not a storage place for useless items. Items not meeting that standard will be given appropriate notice to remove them or be towed. My objective is to maximize the area for as many residents as possible and cut down on the clutter.

Residents and their guests will be required to operate televisions, stereos, etc. in a way that does not disturb neighbors, taking special care between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. The clubhouse, recreation

LCAM rooms, pickleball courts and the firepits are open from 7:30 a.m. to 10 p.m. Swimming pool use is permitted from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. Some functions may go on later inside the clubhouse as long as noise limitations are observed in consideration of neighboring residents.




Dear Fellow Residents,
